The units provides good general experience in both Obstetrics & Gynaecology.

There is resident consultant cover from 8am -6.15pm Monday- Friday and week-end cover 8am-1pm Saturday and Sunday. We provide good experience in emergency gynaecology with a busy EPAU and SDEC and provide paracentesis for malignant ascites. There are several outpatient hysteroscopy sessions per week.

There is gynaecological surgical training in laparoscopic, open and vaginal hysterectomy . A weekly Gynae Oncology MDT is held with the Gynaecology Oncology tertiary centre at Preston.

Urogynaecology sessions include urodynamics and botox. Nurse led pessary and subfertility clinics.

The teaching programme runs fortnightly and there are monthly clinical governance 'audit' meetings.Part of each meeting is joint with the paediatric team and clinical sessions are cancelled to facilitate attendance.

There are opportunities to complete basic & Intermediate obstetric and gynae scanning. The department has an ultrasound simulator and two laparoscopic box trainers.

There are opportunities to teach medical students from UCLAN, Lancaster and Liverpool Medical Schools and be involved in F1/F2 teaching
