

CT1 Psychiatry: London and South East

<p>Programme Details</p>	<p>Psychiatry is a vital, competitive and constantly evolving specialty. Approximately 16% of the UK population lives in London and by joining the HEE London School you will be affiliated with the largest cohort of mental health trainees in Europe. Working with a diverse healthcare population across London, you will have an unparalleled opportunity to learn</p> <p>Our vision for the London School of Psychiatry is:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Equality, diversity and inclusion in education • Excellence of postgraduate training opportunity • Producing clinical leaders of tomorrow <p>The first years of training in psychiatry are spent in a wide variety of posts to ensure a robust and strong foundation from which to build your chosen specialist skills. Each post during this core training lasts for four or six months and trainees must obtain at least 12 months of experience in general psychiatry in addition to 6 months of older adults psychiatry and a placement in either learning disability or child and adolescent mental health.</p> <p>You can also undertake posts in any of the other specialties of psychiatry of their choice within available resources in particular trust.</p> <p>During core training, universal and necessary skills are developed in, for example, assessment of psychiatric conditions, mental state examinations and management of various clinical situations. Basic psychotherapy skills are developed with supervised therapy cases and progress in all aspects is monitored via workplace based assessments (WBPA) on an online portfolio.</p> <p>You will have an identified a supervisor in each post, responsible for supervising clinical activity and providing an hour of weekly one-to-one clinical /psychiatric supervision. You will also have an educational supervisor providing longer term guidance throughout core training.</p> <p>Assuming satisfactory progress through formal exams and workplace-based assessments, this period of training lasts for three years. Once you have passed the two written exams (Paper A and B) and one clinical exam (CASC) which make up the Membership exams of the Royal College of Psychiatrists, you become a full Member of the College and earn the right to add MRCPsych after your name. You are then eligible to apply for higher training in one of the six specialties: General Psychiatry, Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, Medical Psychotherapy, Learning Disability, Old Age Psychiatry or Forensic Psychiatry or dual training.</p>

<p>Expected Rotation Information</p>	<p>In a standard Core Psychiatry programme, candidates will rotate every 6 months (the 1st Wednesday of February and August of every year).</p> <p>Core training in Psychiatry is a three-year programme where trainees rotate around a number of placements enabling them to gain a rich experience of psychiatry. You should expect to rotate between different NHS Trusts during your programme.</p>
